


After advancing to Eindhoven, this regiment was put under command of the 506th Regiment of the 101st Airborne.



The 11th Armored Division was created in March of 1941. After training in England for several years and nearly deployed to Tunisia, the "Charging Bull" division was finally turned loose in Normandy, landing on June 13, 1944. The division went on to see extensive service in nearly all major campaigns in Europe, including an important role in helping to stop the Germans in the Battle of the Bulge. At Market-Garden, this veteran division played only a secondary role, helping protect the right flank of the XXX Corps, advancing as far as Helmond before the failure of the campaign.
