The 4th Armoured Brigade was formed in North Africa in 1938 and saw extensive service in North Africa, Sicily, and Italy. In January, 1944, the brigade was recalled to England and put into training for the Normandy invasion, where it landed on June 7. The veteran brigade participated in Market Garden as part of VIII Corps, where most of its contribution was in assisting the US 101st Airborne troops protecting the main highway route.
